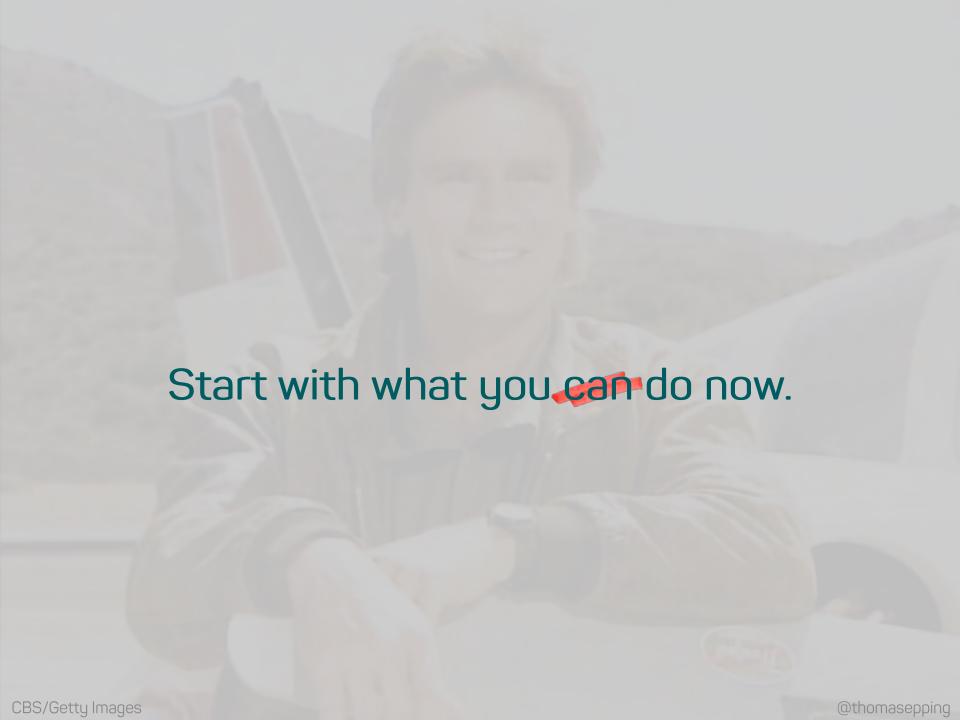

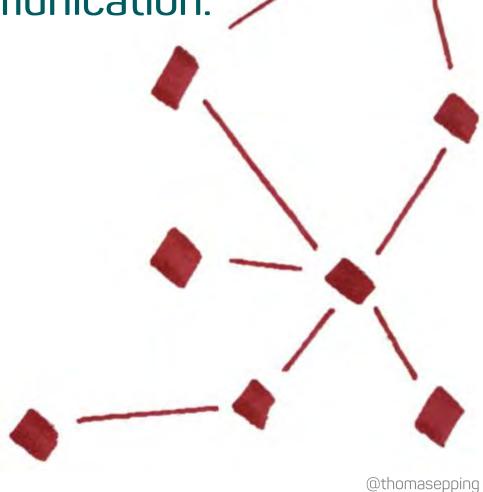

"The smallest unit of all social systems is communication."

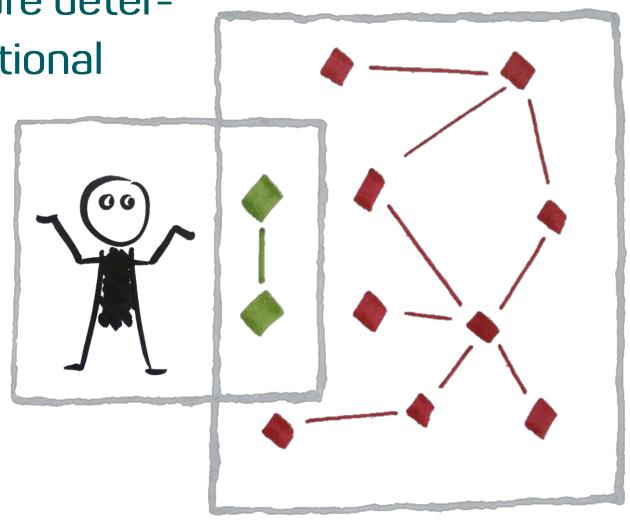

# People-centric

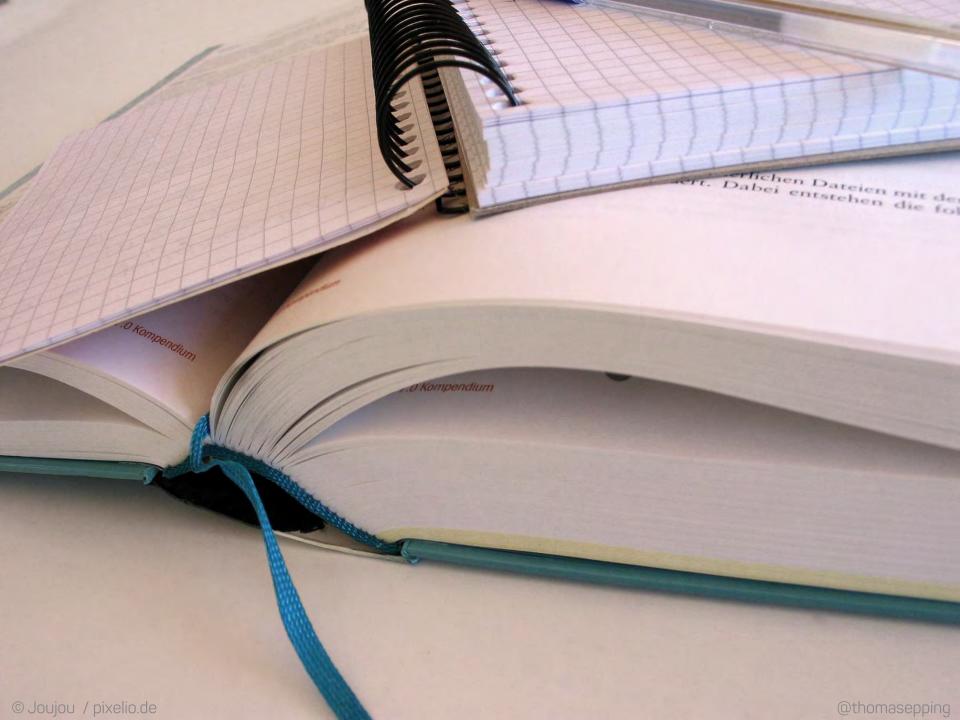
Respect roles, responsibilities, and job titles.

(Start with what you do now.)

# **Systemic**

Respect the organisation.

(You need to, anyway.)



# Do you manage something that is a black box to others?

# **Example** Your desk, a team, a process

Do

Ensure acceptance of the black box
Try to make it your Kanban land
Illustrate with results

**Don't** Announce or promise anything

Start with what you do now

Agree to pursue improvement through evolutionary change

Encourage acts of leadership at every level

#### **Service Delivery Principles**

Are you in charge of, or do you contribute to, any kind of regular feedback meeting?

# **Example** A jour fixe, a round-up, a review

Do

Pick a recurring topic (non-personal)
Provide data to describe actions
Ask if your description seems useful

**Don't** Offer to provide more

Start with what you do now

#### **Service Delivery Principles**

Do you know, or can you find out, types of demand of your work?

# **Example** Tasks, Tickets, User Stories

Do

Make your types of demand explicit Document policies and agreements Show them and provide data

**Don't** 

Suggest improvements

Start with what you do now

#### **Service Delivery Principles**

#### Someone ...

... improves on a service level

... uses innovation for marketing

... starts a Community of Practice

... cancels a meaningless meeting, finally

... switches from opinions to management

... follows through with a cumbersome topic

recognises that your work is useful.

A customer emerges when someone recognises your work and engages.
